Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding has been made and agreed to both parties mentioned below as MoU holders i.e. signed on 29th April 2022 by and between the following two entities collectively referred to as "Parties" and each referred to individually as "First Party" and "Second Party".

Digital University of Skill Resurgence (A Virtual Meta University) is a NPO unit of non- governmental organization of the Society for Applied Development and Research (SADAR) registered in the 2002-03 under Societies Registration Act, 1860, enacted by Council of the Governor General of India. The societies registration act, 1860 is validate legislation in India which allows the registration of entities gently involved in the advancement of society - education, health, employment etc. Digital University of Skill Resurgence- hereinafter referred to as "DUSR" is a virtual meta university operated through online medium to develop vocational skills in young people by updating skills prevalent in professional citizens and focusing on Indian knowledge system, life value and skill development. The University is committed to imbibing EdTech to provide practical professional learning training focused on all major dimensions of human life behaviour. This virtual university is established with the objective of reducing the skills gap prevailing in the society and increasing employment opportunities. Especially in the remote areas of the country where knowledge and skill was prevalent from the centuries, but due to a complex of inferiority they are about to extinct and make a bridge to connect them to the mainstream. In contemporary environment when Government is also emphasizing over developing various skills among citizenry, the DUSR is buckled up for the mission. DUSR having its registered office at 54, Samrat Nagar, Near-Hindi University, Ring Road, Wardha- 442001, Maharashtra, Bharat acting through Dr. Rinju Rai, the Governor and represented by its Registrar, Shri K. K. Agrawal after called as "First Party" which expression shall, where the context so admits, be deemed to include its successors, executors and administrators of the FIRST PARTY

AND

Central Sanskrit University (CSU) is Established on 30th April, 2020 by an act of Parliament as per the Government of India Gazette No. CG-DL-A-17042020-219068, dated 17th April 2020. Earlier Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was established on 15th October 1970 as an autonomous organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act (XXI of 1860) under the control of MHRD which got transformed as Deemed University in 2002.

CSU is a Premier University for promoting Sanskrit studies in India and abroad. It is the biggest Sanskrit University in the world today which is also the only Multi-Campus Sanskrit University. All-round development of all the branches of Sanskrit learning and availability of Sanskrit resources through modern systems are the main objectives of the University. The University is meant for the upliftment of linguistic diversity and cultural plurality while arranging for teaching and research in Sanskrit, Pali and Prakrit in the context of their mutual cultural inter-relationship. It is also committed for the preservation and upliftment of the philosophical and scientific elements in the knowledge systems of these languages and ensuring their availability through the equipments of information and communication technology while establishing the relationship of these knowledge systems with cultural legacy.

The other objectives of the University are:

- To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional research and expansion facilities to the promotion of Sanskrit Language courses in humanities, social sciences and science in its educational Government;
- To take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning process and inter-disciplinary studies and research;
- To educate and train manpower for the overall development;
- To establish the glory of Sanskrit learning in the global context.

Thus, CSU includes all its campuses along with affiliated colleges, research centres and any other related organisations.

WHERE AS, Digital University of Skill Resurgence (DUSR) would be taking steps for the implementation of relevant programmes such as Add- On skill based short term courses, Internship Alternative Programmes mutually decided by both the parties, which would aim to enhance the employability of students by equipping them with Industry / Business relevant skills. In this regard, there are various short, medium and long-term courses undertaken to meet this objective.

AND WHERE AS SECOND PARTY CENTRAL SANSKRIT UNIVERSITY

through DUSR's Education & Skill Development initiatives will work closely with its departments/ schools and affiliated colleges/ institutions to help improve the quality of the employable skills of students of this University Departments and its Colleges. In this regard, the university/ departments/ colleges of the second party shall disseminate/ circulate/ popularize the courses/ programmes of the first party and ensure the enrolment to meet this

objective.

Now it is hereby mutually agreed amongst both parties to this MOU and binds themselves to the terms and conditions enumerated in succeeding paragraphs such as;

1. Roles and Responsibility

The principal roles and responsibility of the parties will be as set out in Articles 1 to 10.

Article 1

DUSR, as First Party will provide Add- On courses / Short term skill based courses/ Internship alternative programmes to the students/ research scholars/ trainees/ faculties/ supportive staffs of the Second Party Central Sanskrit University.

Article 2

The Second Party Central Sanskrit University will circulate/ disseminate the information/ notices/ flyers/ posters amongst the students/ participants regarding the courses/ programmes to be conducted by the First Party DUSR.

Article 3

The First Party DUSR has sole responsibility to take admission/ registration, conduct the online/ virtual/ digital classes, assessments/ tests/ examinations and certifications.

Article 4

The Second Party Central Sanskrit University has no responsibility or any type of involvement in terms of manpower or physical infrastructure wise during conduction of the courses/ programmes.

Article 5

After the course/ programme completion the certificate will be issued by the First Party DUSR and name & logo of the Second Party Central Sanskrit University will also be mentioned on the certificate in a proper manner.

Article 6

The First Party DUSR will charge an amount of cost in terms of course/ programme fee from the students/ participants directly and/ or through the Second Party Central Sanskrit University.

Article 7

The Parties agree to engage in professional/academic/cultural cooperation for the purpose of strengthening bilateral relations between the both institutions.

Article 8

The Parties agree on the possibility of holding public talks, presentations, lectures, training sessions, research works, and other events by the Parties and/or with the participation of the Parties representatives at their premises and/or online.

Article 9

The Parties confirm that they are independent legal entities and neither First Party is an agent or a member of the Second Party, neither First Party has the right or authority to sign any MoUs, undertake any obligation or represent the interests of the Second Party in any other form. The MoU does not constitute any dependency between the Parties.

Article 10

As MoU holder, Second Party Central Sanskrit University has to provide the information regarding its departments/ schools and affiliated colleges/ institutions as well as beneficiaries students, scholars in details to bridge the motto of this MoU to First Party DUSR.

2. Parties Shall

- A. Not use First Party's Intellectual Property unless such First Party consents to such use.
- B. Not do anything which in the reasonable opinion of the First Party is or will be harmful to the reputation of the both parties.
- C. Keep each other informed of any matters relevant to the overall functioning.
- D. Share their expertise or any other information which would be of mutual benefit.

3. Financial Terms and Conditions

- A. The students and research scholars of the university/ departments/ colleges will pay the enrolment fee of the course/ programme in which they might be interested to get admission/ training and certification to the First Party DUSR or will pay as per related provisions made by both parties time to time with proper approval of CSU.
- B. The faculty members and/ or employees of the Second Party CSU may be provided on demand one course free of cost by DUSR per year as per availability and requirement.

4. Duration/ Term of the MOU:

A. The MOU shall begin from the date of its execution by the parties hereto.

- B. This MOU shall continue in full force and effect up to 05 years from the date of signing i.e. up to 28 April, 2027, that is the term required for completion of the certificate of proficiency/ certificate / diploma/ UG/ PG programme students admitted/ enrolled in the university.
- C. Validity of this MOU shall be extended sufficiently early for further period/batches on mutual agreement by the parties to the MOU.
- D. This Memorandum of Understanding is a document of good faith and Implementation of the MOU would be monitored on a six-monthly basis.

5. Termination

- a) Either party may terminate this MOU by mutual understanding by giving 3 (three) months notice in writing served on other.
- b) The parties to the MOU understand that, where a course, as aforesaid, is under continuance, the termination shall take effect only on completion of the subsisting course.
- c) Save as otherwise set out in this MOU, the termination of this MOU howsoever arising is without prejudice to the rights, duties and liabilities of either party accrued prior to termination.

7. Confidentiality

- a) Each party hereto agrees with the other:
 - To keep information in strict confidence and secrecy.
 - Not to use the information save for complying with its obligations under this MOU.
 - Not to disclose the same to a third party other than the party's professional advisers and such employees of the other party on a need to know basis as per requirements of this MOU, who are under a similar duty to protect confidential information, or any third party having a legal right to obtain disclosure thereof.
- b) The restrictions contained in above clause shall apply to both the parties during the term of and for (one) year after the termination of this MOU but shall cease to apply to information or knowledge which:
 - Has in it's entirely become public knowledge otherwise than through any unauthorised disclosure or other breach of such restriction.
 - The First Party has consented in writing to the same being disclosed.
